

Basic Instructions for Viewing IVC Videostream Recordings

The University Center has a Content Server for the purpose of digitally recording IVC (Interactive Videoconferencing) classes, meetings or webinars for playback at another time via the Internet. This type of playback is also known as "On Demand." The purpose of this document is to provide basic instructions on how to view such recordings.

1. To view a recording "On Demand" you should have a high speed connection. Videostreams may not work over a wireless broadband (3G) connection but may work over a Wi-Fi network. Generally a computer connected to a "wired" network will work better than one using a "Wi-Fi" connection.
2. The first step in reviewing a recording is to use an Internet browser (Internet Explorer, Firefox, or Safari) to connect to the following URL: <http://134.39.50.192>
3. Once the web site comes up, find the recording that you would like to view. They are in order by most recent listed first. To see recordings listed by category, scroll down to the bottom of the web page and click on the category you are looking for.
4. Once you find the recording you are looking for, click on it.
5. If prompted for a password, enter "007" or whatever password has been provided.
6. You can view a recording with different video players but the best one to use is Microsoft Silverlight because it provides a full-screen feature and works with all major Internet browsers. After starting to play the recording, just click on the resize icon on the lower right corner of the play window. If you don't already Silverlight installed on your computer you will be promoted to do so. It is free and you only need to install it once.
7. If you prefer, you can also use Windows Media Player or Apple QuickTime Player installed on your computer. Just click on the "Other formats" tab and select the appropriate player.
8. If preferred, you can also choose to download the recording by clicking on the "Download" tab below the viewing window. This can be preferable for those that have laptops as they would then be able to view the recording at any time without being required to have an Internet connection. The file format of such downloads are in MPEG4 so you will be able to play the recording with any MPEG4 capable player on any platform (Macs, PCs, smart phones, etc.).
